### Jefferson Township Community

The Jefferson Township Public School District is a middle-class, suburban community forty-five miles west of Newark in the greater New York metropolitan area. Jefferson Township is primarily a rural-suburban area in the northwest corner of Morris County. The township has a population of over 20,000.

### Jefferson Township High School

Jefferson Township High School is a comprehensive public high school with an enrollment of over 1100 in grades nine through twelve. The school system is accredited by the NJ Department of Education.

### Jefferson Township Curriculum

A single curriculum is offered, making it possible to meet the varied needs of the student body. For graduation, all students must complete four years of English, three years of mathematics, two years of United States history, one year of world history, one year of world languages, three years of science, two years of the arts, and four years of health and physical education.

Honors courses are offered in English, mathematics, science, social studies and world languages. Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, mathematics, science, and social studies.

Students with strong vocational interests attend the Morris County School of Technology on both a full and shared-time basis.

### Advanced Placement Results

Sixty-eight students took a total of one-hundred and seventeen examinations in the spring of 2008.

- 72% of all scores received were three or above
- 78% of the seniors who completed the US History exam in their junior year scored a three or above
- 100% of the seniors who took the English Language exam in their junior year scored a three or above

Special programs are also available for students who are unable to perform adequately on the State's High School Proficiency Assessments, eligible for instruction in English as a second language, and those identified for special education. The District offers self-contained programs for Specific Learning Disabilities and Mildly Cognitively Impaired.
