Using Reports (Teachers)

The following list is only a selection of reporting features available for review under School Stats. Don't see what you are looking for? Visit [School Stats](#) for more options.

If you want to...	Try this!	Why?
Find out the strengths/weaknesses of the class	Select Class Summary Report . [*] Select by subject. Click Suggested Topics or Performance Level Breakdown .	This can help teachers know what topics to focus more class time on or re-teach!
Look at individual statistics for a student's progress	Select Individual Student Report . Choose the student you'd like to view.	Find out a student's needs for help in tutoring, guided practice and mini-lessons!
Find out how much of the program has been passed with a Blue Ribbon by students	Select Blue Ribbon Report . Select the class and program you wish to view. Once run, click on a student's percentage under a subject to view that student's statistics.	This is a quick way to see the percentage of blue ribbons (mastery) your students have.
View a breakdown of all students and progress within all subjects, topics and standards	Select Class Gradebook Report . [*] Choose how you'd like to view class statistics: by subject, program, topic, etc. When running this report, you also have access to Individual Student Reports .	You can view your class statistics in several different ways. You can even filter by dates and times if you want to see specific data!
View missed content within a session for individual students	Select Individual Student Report . Select the student, program and subject you'd like to view. Once the report has loaded, click on the session number for the topic you'd like to view. Once that screen loads, click on View Missed to see exactly what problems your student missed. (You can view sessions from your Class Gradebook Report also.)	Use the data for help pinpointing specific needs within an objective. Gear your teaching to hit exactly the kinds of questions your students need.

Using Reports (Teachers) continued...

If you want to....	Try this!	Why?
View the dates and times of a student's logins for the last 3 months	<p>Select Login Report.</p> <p>Select the class or grade level.</p> <p>Use the filter function to see specific times/dates.</p>	Great information for login incentive programs and to see when, where (IP address) and how frequently students are logging in.
View student statistics based on state assessment reporting categories	<p>Select Class Gradebook Report.*</p> <p>Select the format Subject Broken Down by Reporting Category.</p> <p>Select the class and program you wish to view.</p> <p>Use the filter function to see specific times/dates.</p>	Get an idea of what areas students are strong in before the state assessment. Use for gearing tutoring or review activities.
Compare usage and performance between classes and/or grade levels	<p>Select Class Comparison Report.*</p> <p>Select the format of report you'd like to view.</p> <p>Choose the classes and program you'd like to view.</p> <p>Use the filter function to see specific times/dates.</p>	Allows administrators to compare data between students from different groupings. Helpful in class vs. class motivational challenges.
Compare students or groups of students with other Study Island users in the state.	<p>Select Class Summary Report* or Individual Student Report.</p> <p>Choose the class (and individual student if running the Individual Student Report).</p> <p>Select the program and subject</p> <p>Use the filter function to see specific times/dates.</p> <p>Once in the report, click on the blue Compare with Others button.</p>	Indicates how students are performing in relation to other Study Island users across the state. Great information for parent teacher conferences and for pinpointing areas for remediation.
View results for an assignment created on Class Manager	<p>Select Assignment Report**</p> <p>Select the class and assignment you'd like to view.</p> <p>If you have set assignment dates, use the Filter By Date function to add them.</p>	A more structured approach to using Study Island, using class assignments, allows you to assign specific areas of the program and track the stats through this report .
