# Jefferson Township High School Course Request Worksheet

SENIORS

This worksheet is a guide to help you plan your course of study for next year. Please be sure to review all the graduation requirements, course descriptions, and prerequisites in the Program of Study before making your choices through the Realtime Parent Portal. As you select courses, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

Seniors must schedule a minimum of seven courses in each semester (35 credits). The student's required academic courses, as recommended by the current teacher, will appear in the course selection screen. Typically, seniors will have two academic required courses, or 10 credits (English and Health/PE), chosen for them by their teachers. Students must choose up to six additional elective courses, to fill the remaining credits.

When choosing elective courses, keep in mind that for some of the most popular elective courses, there may not be a seat for every student who wishes to enroll, so it is important for you to choose alternate electives. When choosing electives make sure that you meet all the prerequisite requirements. Also, if you select Honors and AP electives they will either be approved or denied through a department approval process. If you are denied, you may choose to petition into the course. You must do this through your school counselor.

Seniors may choose to have an AM or PM self-directed study. With prior approval, seniors may come in late or leave early when their study period falls during the first or last block of the school day. See your counselor for an approval form.

#### **REALTIME PORTAL DIRECTIONS:**

First, log into the Realtime parent portal and click on the menu choice "Course Requests." You will see all the courses that you are placed in for next year in a graduation sequence. \*

In order to begin choosing your electives, select the department in which the course is offered. Then locate the course you wish to schedule and click the "plus" button next to the name of the course you wish to schedule. You will see your course appear in your course selection screen. If you choose a course by accident, clicking the red "X" button will remove it from your course list.

Some students wish to take a non-credit study hall as a means of allowing them to complete academic work or obtain extra help during the school day. If you wish to schedule a study hall, select both the Fall and Spring semesters from the "Administration" department, give them the same priority level.

After you have chosen your electives click on the "Priorities" button that is located on the right of the screen. Number your priorities from one (1) to five (5) with one (1) being your top choice. If you choose 2 half-year electives, assign the half-year electives the same priority level. Finally, submit your requests by clicking on "Finalize Requests". Once you have finalized your requests, you will not be able to go back and revise your choices.

Please contact your child's counselor if you have any difficulties.

\*Academic Course Placements for students with IEPs will be determined at the student's IEP meeting. Contact your child's case manager with any questions.

NOTE: All level change requests and honors and AP petitions must be completed and turned into the school counselor prior to June 1.
