Program Overview

- One year, intensive employment skills training program on site at Overlook Medical Center
 - Immersion Model
- 8-10 interns per year; ages 18-21 with disabilities from the Greater Union County Area
- Intensive travel training occurring the summer before the program begins.
- Students rotate through three internship experiences, each lasting 10-12 weeks
 - Hard, Soft, and Adaptive Skills Development
- 90 minutes of instruction daily in the program classroom
- Ultimate Goal is to help prepare students for competitive employment -- and place them within 9 months of completing the training program.


