



Great Gatsby: Ms. Stettler & Ms. Russo

The FINAL annual Gatsby Gala, hosted by the English 10 Honors students, was held on June 5th. The students did a fantastic job researching and executing projects on different elements of the Roaring Twenties; topics included: The Culinary Experience of the 1920s, The Athletic Arena, Art, Architecture and Interior Design, Journalism and Advertising, Organized Crime, Literature, The Impact of World War 1 and much more. This year each group prepared an engaging and immersive "exhibit" for their topic. All students were dressed in 1920s apparel and, for a day, the gymnasium was transported back in time! JTHS students, parents and staff enjoyed every minute!



Waksman Scholars: Mr. Rose

The Bio-Technology club went to Rutgers to give a poster presentation for the protein they isolated during our experiments in the Bio-technology club. During the year, starting in October they extracted cloned duckweed DNA from bacterial plasmids, and isolated the duckweed protein making DNA. Then they ran them through various markers to check if they a) had the correct wanted DNA, b) were long enough to be tested, and c) had a large enough amount of DNA copies present to be sent for sequencing. Once that was finished they researched the protein that they identified in the duckweed and made the poster which they presented to research Doctors/ Scientists/ and professors. They were identified as Waksman scholars and Mr. Rose as a teaching fellow of the program. They had two students published on the National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI) which is used internationally by research scientists for bioinformatics and gene sequencing. One student is still working on his unknown clones and may be published over the summer with some luck.
