Back-to-School: Dr. Plotts

Dear Parents and Guardians,

I hope this letter finds you well and enjoying the beautiful summer weather. The summer is flying by and I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you and your children to Jefferson Township High School for the 2019-2020 school year. As the "Home of The Falcons" we look forward to seeing you at our Back-To-School Night on Wednesday, September 25th at 7:00 p.m.

The summer of 2019 will go down in history at JTHS. During the summer break, we have been working on many of the approved projects from the recently passed referendum. Six major projects were underway at the high school during the summer of 2019 break. 1) The band and high tech music rooms received new flooring. I have to say "it looks terrific!" 2) The high school is getting a new roof covering most of the building from the front to the back. 3) In the media center, a new Makerspace Innovation Lab has been enlarged and enhanced for optimal student use. We look forward to seeing the increased usage and creativity of our students in this area. 4) The wood shop received a new floor, paint, and tables. 5) We have 3 science classrooms that were completely gutted and done over. They will now be state of the art and aligned with Next Generation Science requirements. They are looking incredible!!! 6) The exterior of the building around those 3 science classrooms have received a face lift with new brick and stucco being applied to the exterior of the high school. I would like to thank the maintenance and custodial staffs for their flexibility in helping us complete these summer challenges.

Student safety and security is a paramount concern for everyone at Jefferson Township High School. We will continue with the same entrance procedures as last year and enter after 7:35 AM and until 2:15 PM by the guidance office entrance at door #3. With that being said, at the retention vestibule we will be using a visitor management system that will require you to present your driver's license or government issued I.D. Then, you will have a sticker printed out for you to wear that identifies that you are allowed in the building. Our security team will be there to assist you should you have any problems. This increased security measure should provide for a better and safer educational environment for all. Located at this door will be a bin for items being dropped off for students. The items will be retrieved by school personnel and delivered accordingly.

Jefferson Township High School invites you to participate in the high school auditorium seat sponsorship. Jefferson Township High School is excited to be continuing our growth and progress of the "The Academy for Environmental Studies." This is a joint venture between Jefferson Township Public Schools and the Morris County School of Technology, and will continue to provide students with scientific knowledge about the natural world while at the same time exploring the environmental, economic, and social aspects of these interactions and how they influence decision-making and policy. Upon graduation, students will have the foundation needed to pursue a degree in environmental studies in preparation for one of the growing numbers of environmental careers in resource management, engineering, business, non-profit work, law, conservation, or education. Each cohort is comprised of approximately fifteen students from all over Morris, Warren and Sussex County, as well as multiple students from Jefferson. This year in a collaborative partnership with Kean University our students will be able to conduct field based research at Jefferson's own Kean Universities Skyland's Campus. The campus is complete with dormitories, a pristine lake for research, and a recently built sky walk in the tree canopies. We are excited to continue working with Kean University and look forward to utilizing the incredible habitat that Jefferson Township provides for future scientific research. Technology is a constant in the Jefferson Township School District. The high school will continue to implement a One-To-One Laptop Computer initiative where all students in grades 9-12 receive Lenovo Thinkpad and Chromebook laptops. Jefferson Township High is proud to continue to use Google and the Google Management Platform for all our student based instructional delivery. As more and more of our staff and students become Google certified, they are able to bring into our district cutting edge technological initiatives. We look forward to seeing how the Google Management Platform, having laptop computers for our students in a one-to-one format, and the utilization of the newly renovated Maker-Space will enhance our students' intellectual opportunities as we prepare global citizens for the 21st century.

The Jefferson Township High School Student Handbook has been updated and revised for the 2019-2020 school year. All of our summer mailing documents are accessible through the Realtime Parent Portal. The documents on the parent portal provide an abundance of information for you and your child so that you may have a terrific school year. The following change was made in the student handbook for next year: Only written notes will be accepted for early dismissal. The office will NOT accept phone calls, emails, and/or facsimile transmissions (faxes) for early dismissals.

The high school marking period and testing schedule is included in my letter for your reference. Please note the dates for quarterly exams, state testing dates, and final exams. Please keep in mind these dates are an integral part of your student's success in his/her educational program.

The Advanced Communication's class has been researching dynamic public speakers and identifying what characteristics distinguish them from ordinary speakers. The students will be able to use this knowledge to enhance their own public speaking. The Principle of Dramatic Arts' class has already written authentic monologues in the first person personifying everyday objects. The creativity of these students is incredibly entertaining. The Falcons have been off to a fast start this fall posting some impressive wins from the gridiron, to the court, and into the trails.

Currently (as of 9/24);

Football remains undefeated (3-0) coming off an impressive victory in Mount Olive under the lights 28-21. The Falcons also earned W's against Hackettstown in week 1 and at home against High Point. Their next game is at Home today vs an undefeated Montville Mustang program.

Girls Soccer sits at 4-1-2 and have already earned a Morris County Tournament win against Dover at home last Saturday. Their other W's come against Newton, Hackettstown and Montville while earning a draw with Kinnelon and Kittatinny. The girls will travel to Whippany Park on Sunday for round 1 action.

Boys Soccer drew the 6th seed in the Morris County Tournament with a perfect 6-0 record. They open their tournament at home in the nest on Saturday against Mount Olive at 11am. The boys wins have come against some tough competition including NJ 19th ranked Hackettstown, Newton, Vernon, Kittatinny, High Point, and Wallkill.

Girls Volleyball continues to improve having most recently knocked off a very tough Paramus team. The team continues to rally in setting program records including winning two opening tournaments including the Warwick tournament as well as the inaugural Pequannock tournaments. Stay tuned for more from this program as they continue to climb the county and state ladder. Volleyball also will host a Halloween Spooktacular invitational in October.



Field Hockey remains competitive after losing key contributors to graduation last year. As they continue to rebuild they hold a 5-4 record and continue to make noise within the conference. Their wins thus far come against Lenape Valley, Sparta, Kittatinny, North Warren, and Pope John. They take the field next against Kittatinny on the 26th.

Cross Country hosted its lone home meet on the 24th. Thus far the running Falcon girls team

sits at 1-2 while the boys are 2-1. The Falcons look to continue to grow a competitive program, bolster their roster, and compete within a tough conference and deep county.
