

# **World Language Connection: Mr. Sica**

#### ASL Students are Signing & Shining!

#### American Sign Language I

Level 1 American Sign Language students are learning how to discuss more than one person, place or thing. This includes comparing and contrasting. Students are working on how to produce the movements associated with these concepts (*non-manual signals*). They are also learning how to gloss longer detailed English sentences into ASL.

#### American Sign Language II

Level 2 students are learning how to conduct and interpret autobiographical conversations. The conversations include:

where they were born, and raised, how to sign their address in ASL structure, how they commute to and from places, how to give directions (walking, driving, train & bus) in ASL structure, and top cities they would like to travel to and why.

Glossing abilities have expanded from basic sentence structure into paragraph narratives. Receptive and expressive skills have naturally evolved.

#### American Sign Language III

Level 3 students are learning the art of ASL Story-Telling. Foundational element such as Role-Shifting are being demonstrated and produced in class. In ASL structure, students are practicing beginner level story-telling abilities using:

character creation, facial expression, eye gaze, role-shifting and personification.

The students first assignment will be to create a "Silent ASL" story. Silent ASL means a story which uses less than 5 actual signs.

# **English Connection: Ms. Wnuk**

From Mrs. Maxwell: AP Literature constructed "book balls" for The Alchemist which allowed students to analyze the protagonist's personal quest as well as strengthen their use of the skills identified by the College Board as being important for the study and analysis of literature. Students also played The Alchemist Scrabble where they needed to explain how each word played related to the text. Also, in order to review the skills that will appear on the quarterly exam, students worked in groups to design and construct a collaborative essay using a previous AP exam prompt.

The Media Center continues to be used by a variety of classes. Students are learning to research. They recorded book talks, 3D printed props for video production class, used the green screen for children's TV show projects, used the dry erase tables for stop-action animation sets, the button maker for promoting their interests and as props, and so much more!
