English Connection: Ms. Wnuk

From Ms. Lindstedt: Spring in the Northeast can be argued as the year's most unpredictable season. Fickle weather that can change on a dime leaves most of us in a limbo of sunshine versus rain, and sometimes Mother Nature throws in one more storm just for good measure. However, if you look close enough, you can spot a similarity between this tempestuous season and Grade 11 English: growth. Moving from fiction to nonfiction, students in Grade 11 English undertake the rigorous task of the Research Paper process. Beginning with a deceptively simple research question, students move through this comprehensive, multistep procedure that culminates in a final exploratory essay. Their growth as readers and writers becomes apparent as they apply strategies taught in previous units. In turn, AP Language and Composition students exhibit their own scholarly development as they undertake the task of rhetorical analysis in preparation for their exam and their studies in Grade 12. Students examine the rhetorical situation from various viewpoints to include speeches, letters, essays and documentaries. The written word becomes a platform for "How?" and "Why?" questioning that leads to exploration, discussion and various written responses. Under close scrutiny, what may have been considered just another reading assignment, now emerges as a specimen of powerful rhetoric. Just like the changing seasons, students in Grade 11 English and AP Language and Composition continue to move forward and display their growth as learners.

The results are in We had two national qualifiers.


- Olivia Oberman came in 1st place in the state for Public Speaking
