Progressive Innovation Drives JTHS

One-to-One Laptop Initiative

We have come to that time in the year when it starts to get colder outside. Although the outside temperatures may be dropping things are really heating up at JTHS. Starting January 2nd, 2018 every student in grades 8 and 9 will be receiving Thinkpad Laptops as part of our One-to-One Laptop initiative. As we strive to make our students more globally competitive and advanced in a 21st century environment, having laptops at school and also being allowed to take the laptops home will only improve communication and student achievement as we continue to use and foster the Google Classroom. After student laptops for grades 8 and 9 are rolled out, a schedule will be provided for the roll-out time frame for additional high school grades.

Maker Space Innovation Lab Program

JTHS is continuing on the theme of fostering innovation and creativity in our student learners with the addition of a Makerspace program that will be set up in our media center. What is a Makerspace? Makerspaces, sometimes also referred to as Hackerspaces, and fablabs are creative do-it-yourself spaces where people can gather to create, invent, and learn. In our Makerspace we envision students being able to share interests, ideas, equipment, technology, and computing. The JTHS Makerspace will have things like a Makerbot 3d printer, electronics, hardware, tools, supplies, and more. We are looking to launch the Makerspace in the media center tentatively for the end of January and or beginning of February. We are looking to raise \$10,000 to successfully launch our Maker space. New Master Schedule

Jefferson Township High School has approved a new master schedule for the 2018-2019 School Year. With the creation of a Master Scheduling Committee at the start of the 2016-2017 school year, the committee was charged with the task of investigating the needs of a new high school master schedule, exploring schedule options like block scheduling, and making data-driven recommendations for a new master schedule. After a year plus of working on this charge, a 4-day rotating block schedule has been approved. This change will improve student achievement in all areas by fostering student led instruction based on engaged learning that is derived by embracing longer class periods. As an educator, I feel that by going from a traditional schedule with 8- 42 minute periods each day, to a 4-day rotating block schedule with 7- 53 minute periods extends the teachable moment and fosters better student engaged learning. More information will be provided as we go forward with this incredible opportunity for the students at Jefferson Township High School.

Language Arts & Media Curriculum Connections: Mrs. Schwimer





This is a power point lesson experience where the instructor can facilitate and control the lesson or students can team up and pace the lesson while the instructor monitors their progress. The lessons allows for practice, corrections, and repetition. Instructors can print out data on how students achieved in each concept presented. The students are able to work and enjoy a pace comfortable for them. December 21st will be the 3rd annual cookie caper for the LLD math classes. The students are sharpening their math skills in the kitchen by making a sweet treat to eat.
