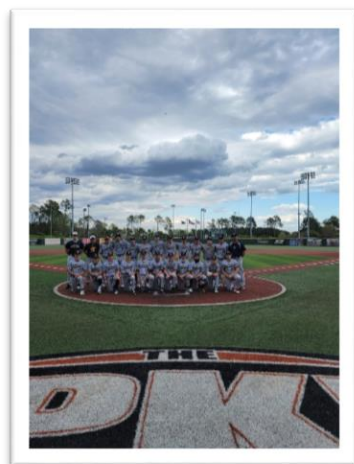

Mrs. Hutchinson's Class had the pleasure of meeting Amy Bodrato. Amy is an instructor as well as a graduate from Fortis Institute. She spoke to the students about the programs they offer: Dental Assisting, Medical Assisting, Medical Coding, HVAC-R & Electrical System Technician!

History -

Freshman Academy World History Honors researched World War I Trench Art. Students then utilized recycled items to create their own Recycled Art, inspired by the Trench Art, and curated a class wide museum exhibit.

Sophomore Academy US History 1 students studied tree rings and how tree rings cannot only be used to study weather patterns but also can highlight trees as silent witnesses to historical events. Students selected and researched events from 1838 to 1860, generated a write up for the event of their choice and then turned the information into QR codes. Students then matched up their events to the classroom tree slice and taught each other about the historical events.

Junior Academy US History 2 students began planting seeds for their "Climate Victory Gardens." In conjunction with a unit on World War II, students have labeled and tracked the growth of their plantings each week and will eventually grow their own Climate Victory Gardens at minimal cost and reducing their carbon impact.
