## • HAVE A GREAT THANKSGIVING BREAK!

This month Athletics does not have good news they have GREAT news. Our High School athletes have accomplished things this fall that have never been done before in Jefferson athletic history.

Football found its way to above .500 this year finishing with a record of 6-3 and making it to the playoffs. While the Falcons fell to River Dell they played an amazing game in the bitter cold that could have gone either way.

Field hockey will be hanging a banner for the first time in program history. They have earned their share of the Colonial NJAC title with a divisional record of 5-2-1 and an overall record of 8-8-2.

Girls Volleyball will also be hanging their first banner in program history after an impressive season which saw the school blocks record be broken in the first round of the state tournament vs Seneca. The girls this season won 3 tournaments another program first, found itself in the county and quarterfinals, and the state second round. The girls will hang their first banner after winning the NJAC Freedom Division title with a conference divisional record of 11-1, conference record of 14-2 and an overall record of 21-6.

Girls Soccer made deep runs into both the county and state tournament for the first time since 1997. This years team will be hanging a 19 on their banner representing their NJAC Freedom Divisional title after amassing a 6-3-1 record. The girls were 10-3-1 in a very competitive conference and 12-6-2 overall. The girls made an exciting run in the Morris County Tournament after beating Dover in the opening round, upsetting Whippany Park and Chatham in the next two earning a spot in the MCT Semi Final. The girls fell to Kinnelon after a 0-0 battle through regulation and 2 overtimes but fell in penalty kicks. The Falcons rebounded well to grind their way through the N1G2 sectional tournament earning a 2 seed. The girls overcame Indian Hills in the first round 6-0, Mahwah in the second round 3-1, and Westwood in the Quarter-Finals 3-0 but fell in penalty kicks to last year's state champion, Ramsey. Girls soccer has also signed 2 athletes to Division 1 programs who participated in the National Letter of Intent Signing Day on November 13th. Madison Eisele and Kayla Barbosa have signed with Manhattan University and Wagner College respectively. These two studs will be on our Next Level record board next fall.

Boys Soccer has historically been at the bottom of the conference but for the past 3 seasons have found themselves as conference champions. This season has been historic for the boys program as they have an unblemished 10-0 divisional record as well as a 16-0 conference record while boasting a 19-1-1 record overall. The boys program who now has 3 conference banners will hang its first sectional title in program history after defeating Lenape Valley 5-0 in the first round, Dover 2-0 in the quarterfinals, Pequannock in penalty kicks, and Ramsey 1-0 in the N1G2 sectional finals hosted at the high school. The boys will play Thursday 11/14 against Bernards in the Group 2 Semifinals at Millburn HS with the winner playing in the Group 2 Finals on Sunday at Kean University.

4 conference titles including 2 first time winners, 1 county semi final appearance, and 2 sectional final appearances with one program taking the title has given JTHS its best Fall season in history.
