The star lab is a portable planetarium that uses a high definition projector to present the various constellations that can be viewed in real time at any location on Earth. Students in Mr. Bruseo, Mrs. Kirshenbaum, and Ms. Beshlian's Earth Science classes entered the lab on January 9th through January 11th to discuss topics in Astronomy. Classes began by identifying the patterns of stars in the constellations that could be observed in the night sky. Students also discussed the concept of light pollution since many of the stars viewed in the lab are not totally visible when students look outside. Finally, the classes concluded by discussing the seasons that occur on Earth by comparing the angle of the sun during the summer and winter solstices.
