- Remain on topic to move the meeting forward


Why Move 5th Grade?

- Level out capacity of the buildings
- Utilization of rooms dedicated to subject areas (art, music, etc.)
- Better utilization of specialists (BSI, specials all in one building)
- Decline in enrollment at Middle and High Schools






Review of Survey Data

The survey received 534 responses.


293 respondents live in the Oak Ridge/Milton side of the township

Do you have a child currently in fourth grade enrolled in Jefferson Township Schools? 534 responses




Do you live in the Oak Ridge or Lake Hopatcong section of Jefferson?





Please choose the option that best describes how you feel about fifth graders being bused to the Middle School.




- I would be comfortable with the fifth graders being on the same bus as the middle schoolers and high schoolers.

- I would be more comfortable if middle schoolers were separated from high schoolers.


If fifth grade moved to the Middle School, before-and-aftercare is a concern for me.




If fifth grade moved to the Middle School, I believe that fifth graders should have playground equipment.








If fifth grade moved to the Middle School, I want my child to have the option of participating in the current co-curricular activities offered at the Middle School.



If fifth grade moved to the Middle School, I want my child to change for physical education classes. 534 responses




Which statement best describes how you are feeling about the possibility of the fifth grade move to the Middle School?




- I am open to moving the fifth grade to the Middle School.

I would be more comfortable with the transition if the move to the Middle School occurred in September 2025.








- Open to having fifth grade join the Middle School.


Respondents who currently have a child in fourth grade

My main concerns of the potential fifth grade move to the Middle School are:

MENTIONED BY MORE THAN 50%

• Busing concerns regarding being with older kids

MENTIONED BY 30-50%

- Missing out on 5th grade traditional activities (parades, parties, leadership, safety patrol, recess, graduation)
- Bullying
- Exposure to inappropriate things for their age (language, sex, drugs)

MENTIONED BY LESS THAN 30%

- Unsupervised activities
- After school care
- Special education students being neglected/not getting as much attention
- Gym
- Earlier start time/missing sleep

The primary benefits of the transition are:

- Expanded electives
- Improve academics for advanced 5th graders
- Maintain programs
- Easier to transition in 6th grade
- Extra-curriculars

Other Comments to Consider:

- Rather consider other options
- Opens up preschool for all Jefferson residents I am all for it
- Whatever the choice, 5th graders are properly monitored, supported, and provided opportunities to get help
- Consider staggering start times for bussing
- Please examine why so many are against moving fifth grade to the MS
- Change needs to be communicated way in advance
- If fifth graders remained in the same classroom except for electives, lunch, and PE it would be the combo of elementary and middle--would support
- Move not appropriate for THIS particular grade due to Covid--push to 2025

Transportation

- The committee prefers that middle and high schoolers be on different buses
- If three tiers is not possible, assign an aide to every bus

Aftercare

- A suggestion was made to add Stanlick and White Rock as bus stops for students who would attend after care
- At this time, there are approximately 10 fifth graders who participate in aftercare

Recess

 The committee is recommending the district purchase playground equipment for the Middle School

Class Structure and Electives

- The committee recommends students remaining in a cohort model, similar to the structure currently in fifth grade
- The committee recommends keeping the core electives they have now and rotate other current MS offerings throughout the year

Co-Curricular Activities

 The committee is recommending fifth graders be allowed to participate in after school clubs and activities

Physical Education

 The committee is recommending that fifth graders do not change for physical education class

Elementary Events

• The committee is recommending that all activities (class parties, parades, Trep\$, safety patrol, etc.) continue

Parent-Teacher Conferences

 The committee is recommending that parent-teacher conferences continue to be held

Grade Terms

• The committee is recommending the fifth grade continue to use trimesters

SEL Programs

 The committee is recommending to continue social-emotional learning programs that are appropriate for the grade level

Overall Recommendation

While the committee realizes the eventual benefit of moving the fifth grade to the Middle School, they are recommending that the move take place in September 2025. This will provide additional time for the students and community to adjust to the changes. It will also provide additional time for the district to implement the move.
