G. <u>PRESENTATIONS</u>

- Mr. Ray Sarinelli, Jr., of auditing firm Nisivoccia, LLP presented the 2022-2023 Annual District Audit Presentation
- Mrs. Jeanne Howe, Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Roger Jinks, Jr., Assistant Superintendent of Schools, and Mrs. Rita Oroho Giacchi, School Business Administrator made a presentation on the Budget Series: Preschool Funding Overview

H. **COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE** (on agenda action items only, if applicable)

- An audience member requested clarification about the number of classrooms required to house the preschool program.
- Several parents played video and/or audio recordings of students campaigning to stay at their respective elementary schools for fifth grade.
- Several audience members appealed to the board to investigate other alternatives for the preschool program, such as trailers or renting a local building.
- Several parents noted their students are upset about losing activities such as morning announcements and safety patrol. They are also concerned about the students being lonely in a fifth grade wing.
- An audience member noted they attended a 6-12 high school and would not want that experience for any students.
- An audience member inquired about the reason for expanding the preschool program, noting their concerns about transportation and parent/teacher conferences.
- An audience member inquired as to when more information regarding the stakeholders would be available.

Mrs. Howe answered all the inquiries that could be answered in a public session.

I. STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

- Student Representative Ashely Hecht reported on events such as the veterans museum, winter sports, a college fair, the fall play, PSAT testing and the National Honor Society brunch. She also noted the first RSVP event is coming up.
- Student Representative Nicholas Roberts reported on the National Honor Society Induction ceremony, the upcoming Hour of Code, and auditions for the spring musical. He reported the Christmas in the Village event is coming up, as well as the holiday assembly and the Madrigal Dinner.

J. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

- **Building Needs and Finance Committee -** Mrs. Gould reported the Committee met on November 14, 2023 and reviewed Preschool Funding Presentation, High School Senior Parking Spaces, 22-23 Audit Results & Preschool Audit Fee, Milton Update, Shared Service Agreement with Wharton BOE, VoTech Academy contract, and Health Benefits Transition Status Update.
 - ❖ Mr. Terpstra stated there are items he felt are not being portrayed as clearly as they could be with regard to declining enrollment. Mrs. Poulas, Board President, reminded Mr. Terpstra of the meeting order and the proper time for this discussion.
 - Mrs. Grater requested the Committee investigate the cost of moving the 5th grade to the middle school.
- **Personnel and Policy Committee** Mr. Stewart reported the Committee met on November 13, 2023 and discussed open employment positions, substitute teacher limits, staff member update, use of an agency for staffing purposes, and policy and regulation review.
 - ❖ Mrs. Grater provided clarification about the GPA adjustment for senior parking privileges.
 - ❖ Mrs. Perez noted she was happy to see the district exploring an agency for aide needs.
- Education Committee Mrs. Small reported the Committee met on November 13, 2023 and discussed the possible reconfiguration and impacts of declining enrollment on high school and middle school programs, as well as the High Impact Tutoring Grant, JTMS LAMP Program update, MS & HS Core Novel Lists, Proposed Research Study, Algebra I for Grade 7, Balanced Literacy, Preschool overview MS program overview, CST Referral Process, and approval of day and overnight field trips.
 - Mrs. Gould asked for clarification on MS activities and awards.
 - ❖ Mrs. Grater asked for clarification about homework.
 - ❖ Mr. Terpstra emphasized that it is great that vandalism is down at the middle school.
 - ❖ Mrs. Perez requested that the CST referral process be advertised.

- Morris County School Boards Association Mr. Stewart noted the upcoming county meeting on bylaws. Mr. Terpstra will attend the Delegate Assembly on December 2, 2023.

O.3 Motion to approve revision to the high school senior parking privilege GPA requirement stated in District Regulation 5514B.6. from 2.50 to 2.00 for the remainder of the 2023-2024 school year only:

WHEREAS, pursuant to District Regulation 5514 high school seniors are granted the privilege to apply for a permit to park a registered vehicle at the high school on a space available basis; and

WHEREAS, among the eligibility requirements for a high school senior to apply for a parking permit is the maintenance of a minimum weighted GPA of 2.50; and

WHEREAS, the high school currently has more parking spaces available than students who qualify and want to park on campus; and

WHEREAS, the high school principal has recommended that the minimum weighted GPA requirement be revised for the remainder of the 2023-2024 school year to allow interested seniors with GPAs between 2.00 and 2.49 to be entered into a lottery for a parking permit, subject to satisfaction of the terms and conditions of District Regulation 5514;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board approves revision to the minimum weighted GPA requirement stated in District Regulation 5514B.6. from 2.50 to a minimum weighted GPA of 2.00 for the remainder of the 2023-2024 school year only.
