**K.2** WHEREAS, school district policy and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3(a) provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2011-2012 school year; and

WHEREAS, maximum expenditure amount allotted for travel and expense reimbursement for the 2010-2011 school year was \$77,011; and

WHEREAS, travel and expense reimbursement has reached a total amount \$53,280 as of March 1, 2011;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jefferson Township Board of Education, in the County of Morris, New Jersey hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2011-2012 school year at the sum of \$70,680; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Education of Jefferson Township has determined that membership in the Workers Compensation Pooled Insurance Program of New Jersey is in the best interest of the District;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved that the Board of Education of Jefferson Township does hereby agree to renew membership in the Workers Compensation Pooled Insurance Program of New Jersey and hereby accept the Bylaws as approved and adopted. The renewal term is from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2014.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board Secretary/Business Administrator is authorized to execute the application for membership and the accompanying certification on behalf of the District and;
