R. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

- Mrs. Scott requested that all documents be done in a .pdf format, making them accessible to all Board members.
- Mrs. Castiglione suggested the district investigate the legality of advertising on its website and using the proceeds towards anti-bullying and anti-drug awareness programs. She also commented on a mentoring program Randolph Township High School and Middle School has adopted. Dr. Fuchs remarked that perhaps a similar program could be included in a PDP program. She noted that the Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) have revolutionized interaction between teachers, students and the community.

- A request was made to consider sharing a vice principal between the high school and middle school.

- An audience member wished to promote the use of netbooks as an alternate to laptops for students and also announced the following activities: the Principals Coffee and College Planning night will take place on April 20, and April is Autism Awareness Month. She also asked that the district website show the numbers showing the cost effectiveness of renovating the Drummond Building.
- An audience member noted that the information supplied regarding the budget is appreciated and suggested more publicity be given for the requirements of a black seal licensed technician for the furnace being moved to Milton.
