E. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Fuchs reported on the *Good News and Progress in Our Schools*. Dr. Fuchs also reviewed some of the fiscal challenges the district will be facing as Governor Christie struggles to close the gap in revenue shortfalls in the state budget.

H. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- **Community Relations Committee** – Mr. Vander Ploeg reported on the web page revision status. He noted that there would be more information available on InfoShare at the next Committee meeting. Mr. Vander Ploeg also commented that the Committee discussed possible ways to familiarize the public with the budget, distribution of Senior Gold Cards, and the results of the Food Service Survey.
- **Building Needs and Finance Committee** – Mrs. Servedio reviewed the WAN/internet upgrade, food service survey and kindergarten feasibility study. She also reviewed the status of the proposed 2010-2011 budget and noted much more work remains to be done, with staffing implications.
- **Education Committee** – Mrs. Scott commented on the Q3 presentation made at the January meeting. She also discussed refining the middle school schedule, AP classes, professional development for Character Counts, overnight field trips and high school electives. Mrs. Servedio commented that are resources available for free materials and lesson plans for Character Counts.
- **Policy and Personnel Committee** – Mrs. Castiglione noted the PERC attendance hearing updates. She also commented on the volunteer job descriptions and other paraprofessionals. Mrs. Servedio noted that the Volunteer Coaching (Paraprofessional) Aide job description, agenda item L.3, had not been distributed and therefore questioned whether or not to hold voting on item L.3. There was consensus to approve item L.3.
- **JTEA Ad Hoc Committee** – Mr. Feldmann noted the primary discussion focused on budget and staff morale. The Committee also discussed strategies to encouraging voter turnout and community participation.
- **Liaison Meeting with Township Council Representatives**– Mrs. Masticola and Mr. Aznano noted they were working in conjunction with township officials Ms. Merz and Mr. Sanchelli on budget constraints and strategies.

WHEREAS, the Federal Government passed the American Recovery Reinvestment Act of 2009, which included domestic spending for education; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey benefited from this legislation with over \$1 billion being directly utilized for funding the education budget for 2009-2010 school year; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, as all states in the union, are amidst a fiscal crisis that could potentially and negatively affect the educational system; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey continues to score above the national average in achievement tests; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey's education system has made great strides in increasing the improvement of student achievement, and has been recently recognized by the Education Trust as one of the top states in closing the achievement gap between low-income or minority students and their peers; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Department of Education has focused on implementing an accountability system for the spending of taxpayers resources; and

WHEREAS, the future of all states and the nation as a whole are dependant upon the education of our children; in the words of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy: "Our progress as a nation can be no swifter than our progress in education. The human mind is our fundamental resource"; and

WHEREAS, without the infusion of federal aid, education in the State of New Jersey is destined to go backwards;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Jefferson Township Board of Education, Morris County, New Jersey, to respectfully request the enactment of federal legislation that would secure funding for the 2010-2011 school year similar to the American Recovery Reinvestment Act of 2009 that funded the 2009-2010 education budgets.
