## E. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u>

Dr. Fuchs reported on the Good News and Progress in Our Schools including the Budget Forum of November 9, contract negotiations for the Jefferson Township Supervisors Association, and Red Ribbon Week activities. Dr. Fuchs also addressed the difficult decisions/choices a board must often make and related it to the budget process. She likened it, as well, to Odysseus' Journey in Homer's Epic "The Odyssey", stating that the Board is guided by what is best for the students.

#### H. <u>STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES</u>

• Student Representative Brandon Coveney commented that the first marking period at the high school went smoothly.

# I. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

- Education Committee Mr. Vander Ploeg reported the committee reviewed the evaluation ranking system, the pyramid of intervention, a proposed rotating schedule at the high school and various field trips, noting however, that there would be no Stokes or Washington, D.C. trip for the middle school in the 2010-2011 school year. Student cell phone use and new curriculum for American sign language were also reviewed. Mrs. Servedio requested clarification on the field trips decision making process and whether they are curriculum related, noting that kids learn from actual experiences, i.e. travel.
- Building Needs and Finance Committee Mr. Anzano reviewed the minutes highlighting topics such as pay-to-participate, courtesy busing and facilities projects. The Committee has reported to the board that it does not support the elimination of courtesy busing. The Committee was however, considering implementing a fee for pick up and drop off at a stop other than the official home address for child care purposes. The district had received a legal opinion that an activity fee for all students, whether participating or not, is not legal. The Committee also will review the report from the architect's feasibility study at the Drummond School.
- Community Relations Mr. Stewart commented on the public budget forum of November 9.
- Policy and Personnel Mrs. Castiglione commented that the Committee has suggested the high school produce a newspaper for students instead of a magazine in an effort to save money. The Committee also reviewed the booster club policy as it relates to disbursement of student fundraising.
