**WHEREAS**, under the Grant Program's requirements, this Board is eligible to file its application for funding with the Department commencing October 28, 2009 if it is to receive funding under the Grant Program in the near future;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Jefferson Township Board of Education that its staff is hereby authorized to file an application with the New Jersey Department of Education seeking Level 1 funding under the Grant Program to be used for replacement of the windows at the Milton School.
