### G. COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE (on agenda action items only, if applicable)

- Several questions and comments were raised regarding the air quality testing at the E. T. Briggs school.
- The Board noted the results of air quality testing at the Briggs School were reported as being within normal ranges. Now that the results have been received, any conjecture should be laid to rest.
- An audience member stated the tests were not 100% conclusive and suggested consulting a Certified Industrial Hygienist.
- The administration was admonished for not taking advantage of the free testing services offered by PEOSHA. The district would look further into this offer to determine its merits and applicability.
- The administration will look into a free program being offered by PEOSHA but the data and results of testing do not support doing so.
- A resident who is a victim of mold, has materials on the subject and offered to share the documents.
- It was noted that a parent survey might be helpful regarding mold issues and concerns.
- It was suggested by the Board that when a student is ill, a visit to a physician may be warranted.
- A question was raised regarding the special education program and the involvement and role of Jefferson Child Care. Mrs. Steinberg cited inclusion.
- An audience member recalled the wonderful experiences in dealing with special education department but questioned why there was no in-class support for college preparatory programs.
- Another person suggested keeping students out of those two classrooms until June.

### R. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

- Mrs. Hardy attended the Girl Scout Gold Awards.
- Mr. Cerny reminded the public about the public budget hearing on March 26, 2008.
- Mrs. Scott stated April 2 as World Autism Awareness Day.
- Mrs. Mastricola attended the Milton PTA meetings and saw the hockey game held at the Mennen Arena and remarked what an amazing job the players did.
- Mrs. Servedio commented on the middle school's mock trial in which the team focused on plagiarism. She also commented on the Falcon Forum, the pennies for puppies campaign; she mentioned that the decision not to hire a full time Behaviorist was based on a cost analysis. Mrs. Servedio also noted that she attended the Keith Hawkins strive for excellence forum.

### S. COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE

- A letter was read promoting a full time staff behaviorist.
- Several comments supporting the addition of a behaviorist, either full or part time, were made.
- An additional Pre-K bus route has been added with positive response. It was noted that aide training should be geared to that grade level.
- A question was raised regarding the status of the Falcon logo election. It was noted that the Board never adopted the logo.
- An audience member stated that his child had been struck in the head by an eraser thrown by a teacher. He requested this inappropriate action be investigated. It was suggested that the protocol of contacting the building principal be followed.

- Several questions were raised regarding the special education curriculum development and the aides. They asked if the aide job description addressed toileting issues.
- Early dismissal including HS/MS classified students are issues being addressed.
- It was noted that the staff has been given the option to participate in a dress down day promoting Autism Awareness Day on April 2 by making a donation of \$5.
- A comment was made regarding school buses driving through puddles and splashing pedestrians.
- JTSNAP appealed to the Board to duplicate and distribute its newsletter.
