• Mrs. Howe reported on the Good News and Progress in our schools.

F. PRESENTATIONS

- Ms. Charlene Petersen, New Jersey School Boards Association Representative, led the audience through the policies, ethics, mandated training, and other aspects of School Board Membership.
- Mrs. Jeanne Howe, Superintendent and Mrs. Rita Oroho Giacchi, Business Administrator presented on School Funding: Past, Present, and Future.
- Mrs. Rita Oroho Giacchi, Business Administrator presented the 2024-2025 Tentative Budget Synopsis.
- Mrs. Jeanne Howe, Superintendent, presented the District Reconfiguration plan.
 - ❖ Mr. Stewart and Mrs. Gould commented on the declining enrollment.
 - ❖ Mrs. Grater commented that it is up to the community to discuss this change in a positive way with their students.
 - ❖ Mrs. Small inquired about the tasks being broken down and brought to the committee level.

G. <u>COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE</u> (on agenda action items only, if applicable)

- An audience member inquired about staggering bus times.
 - ❖ Mrs. Howe advised that bus times will not change for school year 2024-2025.
- An audience member thanked the Board for considering the work of the stakeholder committee and suggested keeping a stakeholder committee in place to ensure the third graders are prepared.
- An audience member suggested emailing the public about presentations such as the school funding presentation tonight. They also suggested notification of a letter writing campaign and noted that while the fifth grade moving to the middle school is not ideal, they do understand the reasons behind the move.
- An audience member inquired about more aggressive advocacy efforts to keep middle and high school students in the district.

Mrs. Howe addressed the inquiries and comments.

H. <u>STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES</u>

• Student Representative Nicholas Roberts reported on the ice cream social fundraiser, the Rec. vs Varsity Girls Basketball game, the Supplies for Soldiers service night and the FBLA Competition. Mr. Roberts also highlighted the upcoming Tulip Trot, musical, spring fling and pep rally, and the field day t-shirt design contest.

I. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

- Education Committee Mrs. Small reported the Committee met on March 4, 2024 and held follow up discussions on study skills and discipline, discussed district reconfiguration, a Memorandum of Understanding for Dual Enrollment with CCM, and day and overnight field trips.
- Policy and Personnel Committee Mrs. Grater reported the Committee met on March 4, 2024 and discussed open positions in district, substitute nurse rate with overnight responsibilities, emergency drills, and policy and regulations.
 - ❖ Mrs. Perez inquired about policy # 5756. Mr. Giacobbe provided an update.
 - ❖ Mrs. Perez asked about drills. Mrs. Poulas provided clarification.
 - ❖ Mrs. Gould asked about differing policies for students wearing jackets in school. Mrs. Poulas indicated there should not be differing policies by school. Mrs. Howe clarified the circumstances of what happened during a drill. Mrs. Gould advocated for students to be able to wear or carry a coat or jacket during the school day.
 - ❖ Mr. Stewart suggested the details should be discussed at Committee.
- **Building Needs and Finance Committee** Mrs. Gould reported the Committee met on March 5 and March 12, 2024 and discussed facilities updates, a Milton facility update, 2023-2024 audit proposal, ROD Grant timeline, and the 2024-2025 Preliminary Budget.
- **Negotiations Committee** Mr. Natale reported the Committee is in discussion with the JTEA, has come to an agreement with the JTSA and is making progress with the JTAEA.
- Community Relations Committee Mrs. Perez noted the Committee met on March 5, 2024 and reviewed the purpose of the Committee, district reconfiguration, social media platforms, Community Outreach, and the 5th grade stakeholders email feedback.
- New Jersey School Board Association Mr. Stewart announced the Unsung Hero dinner will be on March 20, 2024. Mr. Natale reported on the March 9, 2024 Legislative Committee meeting, noting discussions included the 24-25 budget and ways to assist with the teacher shortage.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education includes in the tentative budget the adjustment for enrollment in the amount of \$175,347. The district intends to utilize this adjustment to maintain staffing and curricular expenditures, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education includes in the tentative budget the adjustment for banked cap in the amount of \$154,313. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-10.3(b), the district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority. The adjustment will be used to maintain staffing and curricular expenditures. The Board of Education will incur these expenditures by June 30, 2025 and acknowledges that they cannot be deferred or incrementally completed over a longer period of time.

- **K.3** *BE IT RESOLVED*, the Board of Education includes in the 2024-2025 budget a capital reserve withdrawal in the amount of \$1,385,320 for:
 - Partial Funding of the Roof Replacement Project at White Rock Elementary School
 - Paving of the Bus Compound Parking Lot
- **K.4** *WHEREAS*, school district policy and N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3(a) provides the Jefferson Township Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2024-2025 school year; and
